

### <u>Instrument choice notes</u>:

- Egg shaker
- Same type of instrument with which Sam represented himself
- Same instrument as was used for most members of the portrait
- Instrument was chosen quickly, perhaps hastily

## <u>Improvisation notes:</u>

- Very short duration (less than five seconds). This improvisation lasted only a fraction of the time spent on any other improvisation.
- High energy. Shaking loudly and quickly, with visibly tight arm muscles.
- Played in front of face, with eyes averted away from the instrument
- Arrythmic: two or three short bursts of play, of unpredictable lengths
- Abrupt ending

#### Visual placement notes:

- As far away as possible from Sam's self-instrument outside the initially established portrait area
- Elevated above all other instruments
- Bean bag serves as a barrier between Mom and all other family members
- Placed on a soft, cushioned surface
- Placed alone, not near any other family members

## Therapist impressions of client perceptions about this family member:

- Sam wishes to avoid Mom (as evidenced by resistance to include her in the portrait at all, quick ending to improvisation, averted eyes during improvisation, and placement of Mom's instrument outside the portrait space)
- Mom evokes strong feelings for Sam (a.e.b. fast, sporadic play and muscle tension during improvisation)
- Sam maintains a sense of shared familial identity with Mom (a.e.b. same instrument type chosen for self as for Mom)
- Mom abandons abruptly (a.e.b. improvisation ending)
- Mom is abrasive and chaotic (a.e.b. style of play and arrhythmic qualities)
